Hayden Lee, a 9 year-old prodigy has recently wowed audiences at Carnegie Hall.

The third-grader from Zukeran Elementary School, Okinawa plays music composed by Bach, Mozart and Mendelssohn from memory.

Hayden was born and raised in Hawaii and recently moved to Okinawa with his parents who are civilians with the Navy.

Hayden became inspired to learn piano at 6 years old, after watching an older cousin playing a keyboard.

Hayden's first piano teacher was shrine friend - **Akiko Sanai**. Hayden trained under Akiko for two years and began to develop his own technique of visualizing colors and shapes to play songs by ear.

Before moving to Japan, he played in Rome, where he won first place in the Grand prize Virtuoso International Music Competition.

"There is no limit." Akiko said. "I think he will be who he wants to be and do what he wants to do with the piano."

Akiko was born and raised in Yamaguchi prefecture, Japan and began learning and playing the piano from the age of six.

She is a concert pianist, board member of the Honolulu Piano Teachers Association and an active member of the Music Teachers National Association. She was recognized as Best Piano Teacher by Steinway & Sons and has since served as a judge for Steinway & Sons piano competitions. Akiko is also known in the music circle as a gifted teacher.

Two other students of Akiko - Kaya Smith and Anna Kobayashi has also performed at Carnegie Hall. Akiko has two studios - one In Kuliouou and another one in Kaimuki.

# Maintenance

The Bathroom Project continues with pipe replacement for the girl's bathroom, main kitchen and hall patio.

Several pipes were relocated to a more accessible location within the structure.

Cement was poured to restore the concrete slab foundation which encases the plumbing lines.

Bathroom floors were primed and painted to prevent moisture from seeping inside.

A large hole was cut in the boy's bathroom wall in June to access and repair the problem pipes. The gaping hole in the drywall was repaired August 18.

Several skim coats of drywall compound was used. Once dried, the wall will be sanded the week of 8/19 to level the repair with the surrounding wall.

The last load from the rolloff was picked up, signaling that the end of the project was approaching.
