In Japanese culture, it is customary to bring gifts when visiting relatives or friends hospitalized for a few days.

Surgery, whether it is minor or major can be filled with anxiety. When the unknown looms in front of us - a private blessing gives peace to our hearts and our bodies.

A private blessing for peace, healing and success was performed for a shrine

It's crucial to respect their needs and privacy prior to the visit and is always best to ask the patient or family member if a visit is welcome and appropriate.

Gifts that are taboo in Japanese culture:

- Potted plants with roots sends the

message that you hope they grow roots there and never go home.

- Never give *kiku* or chrysanthemums. These flowers are used for grave visits and funerals.

Tsubaki or camellias are also off limits as the flower head's fall from the stem is associated with the swiftness of a samurai's kill.

- Best to stay away from foodstuff, if you're unsure of their dietary restrictions or hospital policies.



Warmest Congratulations on the birth of your little bundle of joy! We welcome your new baby with wishes of health, happiness and plenty of sleep!
