Shu-in Shrine Seals

A **shuin** (朱印) is a seal given to worshippers and visitors to Shinto shrines and Buddhist temples. *Shu* means vermilion red and *In* means seal.

The seals are collected in books called *shuinchō* that are often sold at shrines and temples.

The seals are actually wooden stamps engraved like chops, using ancient characters. The shu-in is either pre-stamped onto sheets of washi paper or stamped as requested by worshippers.

To create the shuin, the writer presses down one or more large wooden stamps, and then uses black sumi ink to write the name of the shrine and other messages on and around the stamped portions.

There are various theories about the origin of shuin, though the strongest is that it was a receipt for dedicating Hokekyo sutras at a temple. This practice began during the mid-Edo period.

Special shu-in-chō are available for people who do pilgrimages such as the Kansai

Kannon Pilgrimage and the Shikoku Pilgrimage. People who do the Shikoku pilgrimage can also get shuin on the white robes they sometimes wear.

Collecting *shu-in* from various places of worship is extremely popular in Japan, especially among the younger Japanese.

It's so popular, there's even an expression "Go-shu-in girl" which means a young girl who is obsessed with collecting *shu-in*.
